**Position:** Airplane Flight Instructor

**Brief Description of Duties:** Administers combat flight training to military VIP/SAM aircrews. Instruct and evaluates pilots through a broad training spectrum, in addition to performing pilot duties, which may include but is not limited to: Initial Qualification Training, Mission Qualification Training, Continuation Training, Upgrade Training, and Special Capability Training. Assesses flight instructors, pilots and other aircrew members assigned, attached, or newly acquired to the unit to determine flying background and proficiency in the Unit Equipped airplane. Plans, develops, and presents comprehensive courses of instruction in both ground and flight training for pilots to achieve and maintain mission ready status. Performs as flight instructor and/or flight examiner, evaluating and examining rated aircrew to assure training standards are met. Determines progress and proficiency levels; provides re-qualification evaluations and directs/provides specialized remedial or additional training as necessary. Projects unit training requirements. Prepares required training records. Utilizes available training aids to instruct airplane aerodynamics, aircraft systems, emergency procedures, Ability To Survive and Operate (ATSO) and specific crew duties. Maintains a thorough knowledge of airplane systems and procedures under normal, instrument, and emergency conditions. Flight training will be conducted in both day and night missions, in visual and instrument conditions without night vision devices. Briefs and instructs preflight preparations including: intelligence briefings, mission planning, weather factors, mission objectives, and other agency coordination to ensure safe flight procedures and effective accomplishment of the worldwide missions. Conducts a comprehensive debrief of the mission to ensure desired learning objectives were achieved and training rules were followed. Serves as the Commander's representative when performing duties as: Operations Supervisor or Stand-by Duty Officer; and is responsible for the safe and efficient mission accomplishment of the unit through the use of an Operational Risk Management (ORM) program. Incumbents of these positions are subject to rotation to perform administrative task in any of the following Air Operations program support functional areas: Standardization/Evaluation, Weapons and Tactics, Training, Scheduling, Plans, Command and Control, Safety and Wing/Squadron leadership or other duties as assigned.

**Qualifications Requirements:** GS-13

**General Experience:** Rated pilot on flying status, managerial, professional or technical work experience and/or training which has provided knowledge of management principles, practices, methods and techniques.

**Specialized Experience:**

Must demonstrate Thirty-six (36) months experience in which the following Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities (KSA's) as described below have been attained.

**Knowledge, Skills and Abilities (KSA's) Statements:**

- A. Ability to instruct students or rated pilots in instrument flying techniques and methods of instruction.
- B. Skilled in flying aircraft with advanced electronic navigation systems during the day and night, over all kinds of terrain and in any weather.
- C. Experience in serving as pilot or co-pilot on various missions involving training, operational, and/or VIP/SAM flights.
- D. Ability to manage assigned fiscal, material and personnel resources.
- E. Skilled in providing technical and administrative direction to the aviation workforce.
