Position: Aircraft Pneud System Mechanic
Brief Description of Duties: Performs maintenance and operational and functional checks on assigned pneudraulic systems. Troubleshoots, removes, inspect, installs, repairs, modifies, rebuilds, and/or test pneudraulic systems and components for aircraft pneudraulic systems, associated ground support equipment, and/or related test equipment. Performs installation, modification, and/or aircraft pneudraulic systems. Determines proper maintenance and repair procedures and minimum requirements pertaining to parts, clearance and tolerances, and performance characteristics of pneudraulic systems and related aerospace ground equipment. Performs organizational and field level maintenance to include periodic, phase time, calendar, unscheduled, and special inspection. Provides technical assistance to other shops concerning complicated interaction mal functions between other systems, subsystems, and components. Prepares for and participates in various types of readiness evaluations such as ORI, IG, and UE inspections, mobility, and command support exercises. May be required to perform such additional duties as structural fire fighting, aircraft fire/crash/rescue duty, serve as security guard, remove snow, load and handle munitions, launch/recover and service of aircraft, operate heavy equipment, maintain facilities and equipment, or serve as a member of a team to cope with natural disasters or civil emergencies. Incumbent may be required to prepare for and support the mission through the accomplishment of duties pertaining to military training, military readiness, force protection and other mission related assignments including, but not limited to, training of traditional Guard members, CWDE/NBC training, exercise participation (ORE/ORI/UCI/MEI/OCI/IG, etc.), mobility exercise participation, FSTA/ATSO exercise participation, SABC training, LOAC training, weapons qualification training, participation in military formations, and medical mobility processing within the guidelines of NGB/ARNG/ANG/State/TAG rules, regulations and laws. Performs other duties as assigned.
Qualifications: 1. Must have a SECRET security clearance or be able to obtain one within 6 months. 2. Selectee must agree to attend the first available qualification course OR already be AFSC qualified in the 2A6X5 career field.
Specialized Experience: Must demonstrate eighteen (18) months experience in which the following Knowledge, Skills and Abilities (KSA's) as described below have been attained.
Knowledge, Skills and Abilities (KSA's) Statements A. Knowledge of basic electrical and mechanical principles. B. Knowledge of hydraulic and pneumatic principles and physical laws governing the behavior of liquids and gases. C. Ability to troubleshoot malfunctions and make necessary adjustments and repairs. D. Ability to use hand tools, jigs, and fixtures and skill in operating special tools.
Eligibility Requirements: 1. Applicants who have been separated for cause from active duty or a previous AGR tour are ineligible. 2. Service members whose initial DCNG AGR order places them at 18 years or more of Total Active Federal Military Service (TAFMS) will require a signed and approved sanctuary waiver prior to beginning tour. *This requirement is not applicable to service members with over 18 years TAFMS. 3. Prior to entry into the AGR Program, member must be medically cleared by the 113th, MDG. 4. Must meet all eligibility requirements in accordance with ANGI 36-101
