AREA OF CONSIDERATION:

Position is open to graduated civil engineering officers who meet the below identified qualifications.

DUTIES:

Responsibilities include leading personnel, managing projects, and overseeing the infrastructure of a facility or installation. This involves strategic planning, translating policy into action, and ensuring the effective building, operation, and maintenance of facilities, roads, and utilities. Commanders are also responsible for emergency management, disaster response, and supporting military operations through construction and logistical support.

Leadership and personnel management

- **Lead and manage personnel:** Lead and managing both military and civilian personnel across a range of mission requirements.
- **Personnel development:** Support the education and development of airmen to build a highly skilled and diverse workforce.
- **Delegate tasks:** Delegate tasks to engineering teams and supervise staff training.

Planning and project management

- **Translate policy:** Translate high-level policy into actionable guidance for civil engineering functions.
- **Project oversight:** Oversee the planning, design, acquisition, construction, and maintenance of infrastructure like buildings, roads, and utility systems.
- **Resource optimization:** Optimize infrastructure and reduce vulnerabilities through data-driven decisions.
- **Budget and cost:** Approve budgets and manage the costs, materials, and labor required for projects.

Operations and maintenance

- **Manage assets:** Manage and provide assets including facilities, infrastructure, and real estate.
- **Facility sustainment:** Provide facility and base sustainment services and manage energy and utility systems.

- **Quality control:** Ensure construction quality by monitoring site work and making sure it adheres to plans.
- **Prioritize work:** Use priority lists to rank facility needs and ensure resources are aligned with the highest priorities.

Emergency and contingency operations

- **Disaster response:** Manage and maintain emergency response forces and lead efforts in disaster relief and contingency operations.
- **Emergency services:** Oversee fire and emergency services for the installation.
- **Combat support:** Support combat operations and activities, including tasks like airfield damage recovery and responding to CBRN (Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear) threats.
- **Expeditionary support:** Lead construction battalions in expeditionary environments for tasks such as base construction, disaster relief, and humanitarian assistance.

QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Be a part of the DCANG or eligible to transfer into the DCANG.
2. Captain (Promotable) – Lieutenant Colonel
3. Current and Passing fitness assessment (within 12 months)

EVALUATION PROCESS:

Applicants are required to meet a board. Selectee will be notified by the selecting official upon completion of the board.
