<p>Position Description:</p> <p>Performs duties as an Aircraft Maintenance Technician with the expectation to attain full qualification as a Primary Flying Crew Chief, serve as the off-station all-systems subject matter expert on assigned C-40C aircraft, and consistently perform effectively in high-stress, fast-paced environments while upholding the highest standards of professionalism across all associated tasks, certifications, and operational requirements. Performs sortie generation, ground handling, and servicing operations both at home station and abroad. Executes and manages off-station maintenance activities during TDY and transient operations with minimal supervision, ensuring aircraft remain mission capable while coordinating maintenance actions, resources, and support requirements away from home station. Performs aircraft inspections such as preflight, thru-flight, post-flight, hourly post-flight, special inspections, and letter check inspections. Advises on problems, maintenance, servicing, and inspection of aircraft and related aerospace equipment. Uses technical data to diagnose and resolve maintenance issues on aircraft systems. Interprets and applies maintenance procedures and policies to repair aircraft and associated equipment. Inspects, troubleshoots, and maintains aircraft structures, engines, hydraulic systems, and other related components. Removes and installs aircraft and engine components. Conducts operational checks and performs system repairs. Performs ground engine operations and adjusts, aligns, and rigs aircraft systems. Accomplishes weight and balance functions. Supervises and performs aircraft jacking, lifting, and towing operations. Oversees and conducts aircraft, engine, and component inspections, interpreting findings and determining adequacy of corrective actions. Ensures components meet required clearances, tolerances, installation, and operational standards. Performs pre-use inspections and operates powered and non-powered aerospace ground equipment. Identifies and mitigates aircraft corrosion. Reviews maintenance documentation, aircraft records, and automated systems to ensure accuracy and completeness. Maintains accountability of aircraft and alternate mission equipment. Coordinates maintenance plans and schedules to meet operational requirements. Supervises and assists in launching and recovering aircraft. Analyzes maintenance data to identify trends and production effectiveness. Performs crash recovery duties and executes staff and supervisory management functions. Performs other duties as assigned.</p>
<p>Minimum Qualification Requirements:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Must have a Secret security clearance. 2. Must hold AFSC listed. 3. This position is to work on a fleet of C-40C's (737 Boeing Business Jet) supporting VIP airlift operations. Airframe and Powerplant (A&P) License will be considered in lieu of 2A5XX AFSC.
