Description: The A5 Plans directorate provides oversight and serves as the primary advisor to the Headquarters District of Columbia Air National Guard (HQ DC ANG) leadership regarding strategies, plans, and policy recommendations. This support includes provision of military advice across the full spectrum of national security concerns to DC ANG leaders and to ensure those recommendations are informed by a larger strategic context-coordinated with inter-agency and alliance partners account for the view and requirements of the Air and Army Commanders, and assess risk in executing the Military Strategy. The A5 also serves as senior strategic and long-range planner responsible for developing the HQ DC ANG's view of the future as well as detailed strategic policy, plans, initiatives, and federal and state homeland security, civil support missions, and selected other activities for the organization based on broad guidance from higher headquarters and specific guidance from the Commander, District of Columbia Air National Guard.

Directs and monitors support activities and units. Ensures cohesive integration of functions and resources in force protection; civil engineering (CE); communications - computer; morale, welfare, recreation, and services (MWRS); public affairs; personnel; information management; and manpower to support installation, Wing, and mission needs.

Serves as the Wing Inspection Team point of contact and acts as command monitor for inspection reports and special interest items. Inspects units and activities for compliance with directives and standardization of operation. Manages the base exercise evaluation team program. Monitors readiness of communications, logistics, personnel, and other support functions directly affecting unit mission. Assists in planning, executing, evaluating, and critiquing base-wide emergency and contingency exercises. Develops exercise objectives and scenario events list. Debriefs exercise participants and publishes written reports.
